Reclaiming Education will discuss how best to make education a public service that is accountable to local communities. The conference will build on the manifesto “*A Better Future for our Schools*”, developed over the last three years and launched at the House of Commons last June.

- Setting the broad aims of education to ensure that young people are able to develop the knowledge, skills and qualities that they will need in their adult lives
- How local communities - rather than ministers in Whitehall - can influence the education of their children.
- Providing fair access to good schools for all young people.
- Resisting the pressure to privatise schooling.
